Bakari Award

The Bakari Awards is an annual ceremony and rites of passage program held by The Prep's Office of Diversity and Inclusion, to celebrate the achievements of our students of color. The name Bakari is Swahili for "fulfilling a noble promise". Held prior to commencement activities, graduating seniors are inducted into the African American and Latino Alumni Association and are presented with Kente cloth that many wear during their graduation ceremony.

For nearly 20 years, A4 facilitated annual summer visits to colleges and universities around the country for Black and Latino students at The Prep. These trips facilitated conversations with students of color on campus life, scholarship and financial aid opportunities, and to provide an on-campus experience for students to see some of the best institutions of higher education up close and personal.

Mentoring
